






In England, over 2.8m people have now been invited for Lung Cancer Screening

- Nearly 1.5m Lung Health Checks completed
- Over 950,000 scans completed
- 60% uptake to Lung Health Check
- 1.4% lung cancer conversion rate






ED for lung cancer has increased for all deprivation quintiles post-pandemic, with the biggest gains seen among those living in the most deprived areas



Whilst supporting day-to-day roll out, nationally we are focussing on the path to a national screening programme



Our priorities for 2025/2026 are getting the basics right, with an eye on innovation

- Budget negotiations for future funding
- Implementing a patient level dataset
- Ensuring all sites have an ICT system
- Piloting a digital Lung Health Check

Complete an NHS lung cancer risk check

The NHS lung cancer risk check will ask you some questions about your medical history and lifestyle to work out your risk of getting lung cancer.

Lung cancer screening aims to find lung cancer early, sometimes before you have symptoms. Early diagnosis can make lung cancer more treatable and make treatment more successful.

You are eligible for this service if you are:

- · aged between 55 and 74
- · registered with a GP surgery
- · someone who smokes or used to smoke

What to expect

To understand your level of risk we will ask you questions about:

- · your height and weight
- · your ethnicity
- · the highest level of education you completed
- · if you have ever had a cancer diagnosis
- if your parents, siblings, or children have ever had a lung cancer diagnosis
- · your smoking habits

The NHS lung cancer risk check will use your answers to predict your risk of developing lung cancer in the next 5 years.
